- Entries must be postmarked no later than September 01, 2008.
- Late entries accepted until September 15th, 2008
- Required entry fees, stall fees, and copies of registration certificates must accompany entry form.
- This is an ALSA sanctioned single show. All rules and guidelines for the show will be in accordance with the Current Edition ALSA Handbook.
- Major changes for 2008 ALSA Shows ...
All llamas entered in approved classes, with the exception of youth classes must be registered or have passed screening with the ILR or CLRC. This also applies to juveniles. If non breeders are not registered and wish to participate in the ALSA award system and wish to show in halter, they must show in the Adult Non Breeder halter class.
- Non Breeder llamas must be accompanied by a veterinary certificate verifying that the animal is a gelding, vasectomized, or a spayed or non productive female.
- All exhibitors must be current 2008 members of ALSA or pay a \$30.00 non-member fee. Members must be either listed in the 2008 ALSA Membership List or send a copy of their 2008 ALSA membership card with their entry form.
- Animals will be allowed into the barn on Thursday September 18th.
- There is no straw or paper bedding allowed at the facility. Mats, tiles, or sod may be used. Sod is available for purchase at \$75.00 per stall.
- Camping facilities are available. Contact Phil Feiner.
- Vendor spaces are available. Contact Pam Jensen
- Iowa Requirements: A 30 day health certificate is required.

- There will be a Jackpot Obstacle Futurity at the completion of the ALSA show on Friday. This event is open to Llamas of all ages. 100 % of the entries will be distributed to the first three placing animals.
- Please enter you animal in the appropriate wool class.
Suri: Fleece with luster and hand that drapes over the llama's body, usually forming a natural part along the spine. Fibers are grouped into very distinctive and well defined lock structure, with the absence of crimp and loft.

Light: Minimal body wool, short neck wool, no leg wool.

Medium: Moderate to long body wool, minimal to moderate neck wool, smooth to moderate leg wool.

Heavy: Abundant body and neck wool with moderate to abundant leg wool.

- If entering after September 1, 2008, a \$15.00 late entry fee per class will be charged.
- Get and produce entries may be added after exhibitor arrival at the show. Offspring must be entered in the ALSA show.
- Exhibitor meeting will take place at 7:30 am Friday morning.
- A photographer will be available to take pictures during the show.
- Premiums will be paid to the first three placings and ribbons through sixth place. Grand and reserve Champions will receive premiums as well.
- Show book advertising is available at a rate of \$100.00 for a full page ad, \$50.00 for a half page, and \$25.00 for a quarter page ad. Camera ready artwork required please.
