- The Fall Harvest Show is both an ALSA and an ILR-SD sanctioned show. Exhibitors need not be LFA members to exhibit in the Fall Harvest Show.
- Entries may be in ALSA only, ILR-SD only, or both show associations. Required entry fees, stall fees, DNA testing results for the Claims Futurity, and copies of registration certificates must accompany the entry form. Or, paper copies may be mailed to Kay Berg, P.O. Box 838, Ellsworth, WI 54011. Or, register on line with the LFA electronic registration page.
- Entries for the Fall Harvest Llama Show must be postmarked no later than September 01, 2011.
- Late entries accepted until September 16, 2011
- If entering after September 1, 2011, a \$15.00 late entry fee per class will be charged.
- All llamas entered in approved classes must be registered or have passed screening with the ILR or CLRC. This also applies to juveniles.
- Awards: One set of ribbons will be awarded for first through sixth place in each combined ALSA and ILR-SD class. The top two of each class will then be brought back to be awarded Grand and Champion for both ALSA and ILR-SD. Ribbons will be awarded to Grand and Reserve Champions. Finally, all the Grand Champions will be brought back for one overall Best of Show
- Get of Sire and Produce entries may be added after exhibitor arrival at the show. Offspring must be entered in the appropriate halter classes. Get of Sire will have three entries from the same sire.
- Please enter your animal in the appropriate wool division.
- Mini llamas should follow AMLA Guidelines.

- Fleece classes will be judged as open classes. Ribbons will be granted to sixth place, with the winner receiving \$50. A Grand and Reserve Champion will be awarded for each fleece division.
- Bred and owned classes are open to any sex, fiber type and age of the llama. The llama must have been bred and be currently owned by the breeder. Placings will be through sixth place with the winner receiving \$50.
- Fun classes - Tallest Llama and the color class will be open classes, judged as “for fun.” The tallest llama will be measured at the poll. The color class is any unique pattern or color. The fun classes are open to any sex, fiber type and age of llama. Placings will be through sixth place with the winner receiving \$50.
- Animals will be allowed into the barn for stalling on Thursday, September 15th, after 12:00 PM. Access to the wash stalls only, is available on Thursday morning. Weather permitting, gate panels could be set up by owners on the lawn.
- Stalls are lined with rubber, which does not allow drainage. Mats or tiles may be used.. Straw, hay, or cardboard bedding will be allowed at the facility. Paper bedding is not permitted. Sod is available for purchase at \$50.00 per stall. Please order in advance on the registration form. Or, contact [Bob Minto.](#) If the stall is not cleaned before leaving the facility, the exhibitor will be charged \$50.00 for removal.

Tack stalls will not be provided. Tack stalls may be requested for \$50.

- Iowa Health Requirements: A 30 day health certificate is required.
- Exhibitor meeting will take place at 9:30 am Friday morning, for the halter show. Fleece judging will begin at 9:00 AM. Please see the [complete schedule](#) for the weekend, on line.
